## The queen's family

In November 1947, when Princess Elizabeth was 21 years old, she married Lt. Philip Mountbatten. He became known then as the Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Philip.

Prince Philip died in April 2021 at age 99.

## The heir apparent

The first person in line to be monarch is Prince Charles, the first son of Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip.

Heir (air) apparent means Prince Charles will inherit the title of sovereign (SAH-ver-un), or leader, from his mother when she dies or gives up the throne.



Although Prince Charles has a sister and

two brothers, next in line for the throne is his first son, Prince William, the Duke of Cambridge.

Prince William is the son of Prince Charles and Princess Diana, Prince Charles' first wife. He is 39 years old. His younger brother, Prince

Harry, now lives in the United States.

Prince George, 8, is third in line to the British throne. George is the son of Prince William and his wife, Catherine, Duchess of Cambridge.

A study of orangutans in Borneo and Sumatra reveals that groups of the apes use slang terms to show off their "coolness."
